Ruislip Manor Safer Neighbourhoods Team

Youth charged with 3 accounts of Criminal Damage.

ASB by vehicles.

A known youth has been taken to court for causing thousands of pounds worth of criminal damage to shop windows, bus shelters, lamp posts etc. The offender and graffiti tag has been identified from various recordings of cctv, also when the offender was arrested he has displayed his tag in the cell which is also recorded by cctv.

The team took part in a Automatic Number Plate Reader Operation with Traffic Officers whereby a special camera reads number plates and recognises vehicles that are being illegally driven on the road. The team reported several vehicles for no tax, insurance, illegal number plates.

Two local youths arrested and prosecuted for interfering with a motor vehicle.

The team have continually monitored the Jim Oneill Walk, walk way next to Ruislip High School, Sidmouth Drive where the school have encountered anti social behaviour from youths drinking alcohol and throwing glass bottles in the astro turf on the school property. The team have stopped and spoken to over 40 youths congregating on the grass verges, alcohol and cigarettes seized, 1 female was taken home to her parents.

Test Purchasing with Youth Diversion Officer on local shops in Ruislip Manor where local underage cadets when into shop and tried to purchase alcohol. If cadets were successful then premises owner is given £80 fine. All Ruislip Manor shops asked for identification and refused to sell the cadets alcohol.

The team have been gathering evidence against known youths within the ward and the local vicinity who have been conducting ASB around the ward. The information being gathered will contribute to an Anti social Behaviour Contract (ABC) and can lead to an ASBO.

Sidmouth Drive is a road continually used by oversized vehicles, the team are prosecuting large goods vehicle drivers and warning letters are sent to the company HQ.

Youths using scooters have also become a problem especially in the early hours racing up and down the roads, we ask that if you note down the number plate and let us know about it.

Several drivers have been stopped and educated, some prosecuted for exceeding local speed limits in Sidmouth Drive, Victoria Rd and Cornwall Rd. We will soon be using the speed gun in Dulverton Rd and Beverley Rd.

Dispersal Zone

A Dispersal Zone has been agreed and signed for the Ruislip Manor shopping parade and will expire in late December 2008. This stops groups hanging around The Manor. And can be dispersed into groups of two by a Police Officer or a PCSO.
